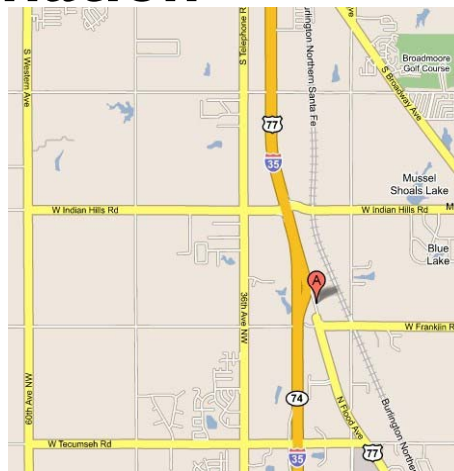
From Norman:

(1) Head North in HWY 77 (Flood Ave) to Franklin Road (One mile North of Tecumseh Road. Turn right (East) and

take the first Left (North) onto I-35 access road.

(2) Head North on I-35 past Robinson. Exit on Tecumseh Road. Turn Left (East) on Tecumseh Road. At the first stop light (HWY 77/Flood Ave), turn Left (North). Head North on HWY 77 to Franklin Road (one mile North of Tecumseh Road). Turn right (East) and take the first Left (North) onto I-35 access road.
