### ARGONNE NATIONAL LABORATORY TOUR

The October meeting will be a tour led by Ali Khounsary of Argonne's Advanced Photon Source. The first national laboratory, Argonne is one of the nation's leading centers of federally funded research and development. Managed by the University of Chicago, Argonne's mission is to conduct R&D in the national interest in support of the U.S. Department of Energy.

The Advanced Photon Source (APS) at Argonne National Laboratory is a user facility, which produces extremely powerful X-ray beams, providing researchers worldwide with a unique non-destructive research tool. The highly penetrating X-rays are ideally suited for a broad range of applications, from biology to pharmacology, and from engineering to archeology. For example, much of what is known about the three-dimensional arrangement of atoms in materials, or the structure of DNA and viruses, has come from X-ray research. APS which is one of the newest x-ray facilities is taking that research to new levels. APS users come from universities, industry, medical schools and other research institutions to conduct frontier science, studying materials of all types using the APS.

#### **LOCATION AND DIRECTIONS:**

Argonne National Laboratory

Everyone should go directly to the Guard Gate on Northgate Road (off South Cass Avenue). A photo I.D., such as driver's license or passport, is required. Original passport along with original visa and/or I-94 (departure record) are required for any non-U.S. citizens. Gate passes will not be issued without a photo I.D. All vehicles entering the site are subject to search. Below is a map to the facility and information about the tour.

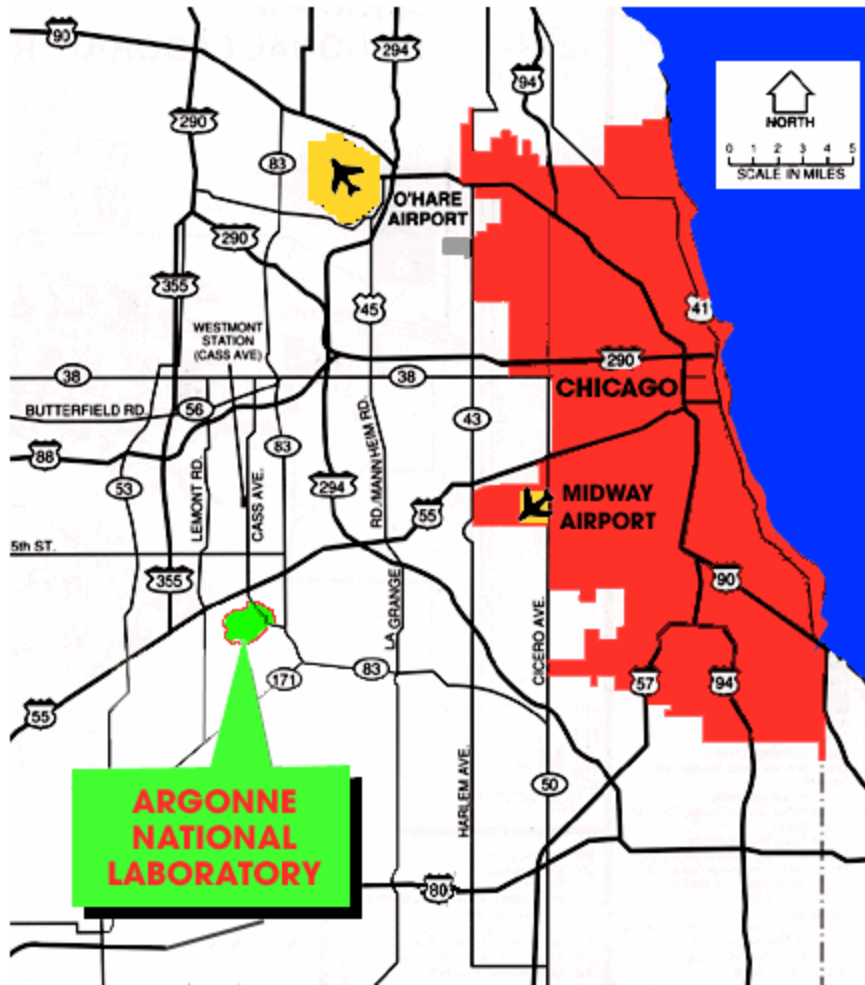
**COST:** \$25.00 payable at the door, by check or cash
