Laboratory Bldg Tour: Saint Louis University Edward A Doisy Research Center



Please join us for a tour of the **Edward A. Doisy Research Center**. The center which was dedicated in December 2007 is a \$82 Million state of the art medical research facility. The center is named for Edward A. Doisy, a Nobel Laureate and a professor at Saint Louis University for five decades. Dr. Doisy was world renowned for

his pioneering work in the field of biochemistry and discovery of the chemical nature of vitamin K. The ten-story building totals 206,000 square feet and connects by a covered walkway to the School of Medicine. Five key areas of medical research in cancer, liver disease, heart/lung disease, aging and brain disease and vaccine development are being pursued at the research center. The research building has many green design features and is currently seeking LEED Silver certification, given by the U.S. Green Building Council, the nation's leader in certification of sustainable buildings. The building was designed by Cannon Design and construction was executed by Clayco Construction Company.

A brief presentation about the research building including some of the green design features will be presented followed by a tour of the building.



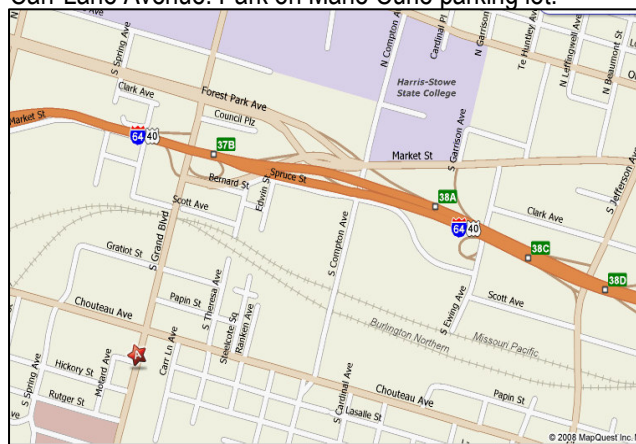
